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1. Introduction

Within Work Package 2 of the CHAIn project, a Kick-off Meeting (KoM) has been conducted on 22nd and 23rd of April 2024 at Saarland University. The KoM aims to discuss different internationalisation strategies and models, facilitate peer learning, and create leadership within CHAIn Cambodian Higher Education Institutions' top management staff. The top management of all partners exchanged their experiences of initial findings and constraints between EU and Cambodia, transfer of good practices and innovative ideas on how to incorporate international relations as an integral part of institutional strategy and policy.

Representatives from the European Commission EACEA and the German Academic Exchange Service DAAD presented the expectations of the Erasmus+ CBHE program.

4. Learning outcomes

The partners received many examples of best practice from the internationalisation of European partners. Main barriers/challenges to be implemented at home institution, answers given by participants:

Human resources and funds:

- Lack of financial support in general
- Lack of financial support for internationalization
- In MoEYS, there's no specific funding to support staff
- Lack of human and financial resources
- No financial support from institution for student mobility, student mobility depends on Scholarship or Fund from the Government.
- Lack of human resources to provide the full services, supports and information for the mobilities
- Improve numbers of staff in IR





- Provide more capacity building for staff, especially IRO staff
- Lack of staff performed work for International Relation Office
- Lack of lectures in English

Structual constraints:

- Language barrier
- Quality of education and research
- Lack of clear structure
- No English taught classes
- No clear strategies and structure of international relation office
- Equipment and software for monitoring the data
- In MoEYS, no specific unit to take responsibility of HE internationalization
- Not enough Erasmus+ grants for Asian countries

5. Conclusions

The Kick-off Meeting facilitated peer learning and created leadership at the strategic level for the top management of the CHAIn partners. By the exchange of initial insights, the partners created a basis for the development of institutional strategies on internationalisation. The meeting allowed the participants to share experiences and good practices with representatives of the European project partners -Saarland University and University of Alicante.





Moreover, the meeting promoted mutual understanding of the partners and their respective situations. All partners consider the meeting to be very useful as start to the project, for forming a team and mission sharing.
